- 6.9 A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated at all times.
- 6.10 Anyone attempting to purchase alcohol (or other age restricted product) that appears to be under the age of 25 years shall be asked to provide proof of age.
- 6.11 The only acceptable forms of identification shall be:
 - PASS accreditation proof of age card.
 - Photo driving licence
 - Current British/UK passport
- 6.12 Clear, prominent and unobstructed signage informing customers of the proof of age scheme in operation, shall be displayed at:
 - All entry points
 - Points of sale
- 6.13 A system of recording sales refused under the proof of age scheme shall be operated at all times.
- 6.14 The refusal book/log shall be kept on the premises and shall be produced upon request of an authorised officer under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6.15 The records relating to the refusal book/log shall be retained on the premises for a minimum of 12 months.
- 6.16 Alcohol may only be sold for consumption "on " the premises to those persons attending a bona fide private function or a bona fide private tour of the brewery where such consumption takes place for the purposes of sampling only. For the avoidance of doubt, there is nothing in this condition which seeks to restrict the sale of alcohol for consumption "off" the premises.
- 6.17 The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a register is maintained detailing any private functions or events that take place on the premises. The register shall detail the date and time of the function, the nature of the function, the date that the function was booked, the name of the person or business booking the function and the number of persons attending the function. The register will be kept on the premises and be made available for production upon request of an officer authorised under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6.18 The Premises Licence Holder or Designated premises Supervisor or a suitably trained nominated representative shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and of any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a complaints log book kept specifically for that purpose. The log book shall be made available for inspection by an authorised officer under the Licensing Act 2003 upon their request.
- 6.19 The Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor or suitable trained nominated representative shall monitor the noise from
