


Darley Park All User Path - What's Happening?

Darley Park was donated to the people of Derby in 1929 by the Evans family who founded Darley Abbey's cotton mills. It was officially opened by HRH the Duke of Kent on 30th June 1931. This is a beautiful park but during the winter months a large mud scar develops primarily from the southern end for some considerable distance. This unsightly scar remains well into the springtime as can be seen on the aerial view below. Following extensive consultation, works have now commenced on constructing a path suitable for all users. The new path will be sympathetic with its surroundings, ensuring visitors have a better experience and make the park accessible to people of all abilities all year round.
